OUR COLLABORATIVE JOURNEY

Welcome! It's important before we begin our work together that you are clear about what you can expect from counseling. This consent to treatment and disclosure statement will inform you about my background, philosophy, approach to counseling, fees, and your rights and responsibilities as a client. I am happy to answer any questions you might have about the information included on this form.

PHILOSOPHY AND APPROACH

Safety. I recognize and honor the privilege it is to journey with you through the most tender places of the soul. My commitment to you is to hold a space of safety and warmth for your journey of exploration and healing – in whatever way that healing takes form.

Wholeness. While we may work with painful events, memories, feelings, and states, I understand that you are not only your pain. Even as we walk through challenging territory, I will continue to hold the truth of your innate wholeness, and support the fullest expression of your authentic “you-ness.”

Non-violence. I deeply value a non-violent approach, never pushing you beyond what you are comfortable with. I also understand that we have a variety of defensive strategies that have helped us navigate an often scary and painful world. I recognize these defenses as assets – skills that have helped keep us alive - while also understanding they do not always serve us in our current life. These too will be met with honor, compassion and care as we explore more inclusive ways of being.

Mindfulness. With training in Hakomi, I often work with clients in a present-moment state of awareness. This state is experiential, an exploration of what is happening real-time inside you including thoughts, feelings, bodily sensations, imagery and surfacing memories. These interconnected experiences help us come into contact with deeply held core beliefs about self and the world and open up potential for core level healing and transformation.

Holistic. I approach this work with the understanding that the body, mind and spirit are deeply interconnected. With this in mind my work includes a combination of approaches:

- Narrative - telling your story
- Mindfulness – non-judgmental, present-moment awareness
- Somatic - welcoming the body's inherent wisdom
- Soul-work - discovering and honoring your sacred uniqueness and purpose in the world
- Heart-work - feeling and welcoming the emotions
- Spiritual unfolding

My work is also informed by attachment theory, neuroscience, transpersonal psychology, indigenous wisdom and nearly 10 years of personal energetic and meditative work.

Touch. Because of this holistic orientation and somatic approach, body awareness and touch are an integral part of

our work together. This could look like you, the client, noticing your own internal body-sensations, the use of blankets or other props, or safe and therapeutic touch. The particular form of touch used by Hakomi body-centered work is used at specific times during therapy to either support the body and/or to facilitate a deepening of experience. The type of touch used in Hakomi is very respectful. It is not massage nor does it involve any removal of clothing. It is non-invasive and is usually only done for short periods of time. Other kinds of touch include compassionate touch and hand-holding. All effort is made to ensure that touch is done with client permission and cooperation, and discontinued immediately should it become unwelcome. Touch of a sexual nature is never appropriate from either client or therapist.

Inclusive. I welcome clients from any race, culture, faith tradition, sexual orientation and gender identity. While I may not know the nuances of your orientation to life I am committed to being culturally sensitive, appreciating the amazing diversity of our time.

PROFESSIONAL DISCLOSURE

I do not assess, diagnose or treat mental health disorders. With extensive training in Transpersonal Psychology, post-graduate clinical chaplaincy training (CPE residency), personal energetic and meditative practice and several years as a full-time hospital chaplain, I have chosen to operate as "exempt from licensure." If you have specific mental health concerns, I am happy to connect you with like-minded, licensed mental health professionals.

CONSULTATION

I consult regularly with other professionals regarding my clients; however, client's identity remains completely anonymous, and confidentiality is fully maintained.

CONFIDENTIALITY

All information disclosed within sessions and the written records related to those sessions are confidential and may not be revealed to anyone without your (client's) written permission, except where disclosure is required by law.

EXCEPTIONS TO PRIVACY

It is important for you to know that some things, by law, cannot be kept private. They include the following:

- If I learn that you intend to harm yourself, I will inform other people who can help you to protect yourself.
- If I am subpoenaed or court ordered to testify in court, I may have to give information about you without your permission. If I am subpoenaed or receive a court order, I will make an effort to contact you. If you oppose release of information, a court may nevertheless order me to disclose information about you.
- If you were to bring suit against me, I may need to break confidentiality in a legal defense.

- If I learn that you have harmed a child or elderly or disabled person, I will make a report to authorities. I may inform family members, other health care providers or the police. Oregon law does not require me to report your intention to hurt another, but I reserve the right to tell that person if I believe they are in danger.
- Providing information concerning case consultation or supervision.

LENGTH OF THERAPY

How long therapy will last depends on your personal growth goals. Some people feel great benefit after a few sessions while others might work for one or two years to achieve the changes in their life they desire. We will evaluate the process together from time to time, to see what has been useful and how your needs might have changed. You have the right to end therapy at any time. Hopefully, we will agree on when to conclude our work together and can have a few sessions to focus on completion.

FEES

I accept cash, checks, PayPal and credit cards. I may raise my fee during the course of your counseling, and if so I will discuss this with you in advance. I do not bill insurance. If desired, I will provide a receipt upon request.

CANCELLATION POLICY

If you miss an appointment or cancel with less than 24 hours notice, you will be asked to pay the full appointment fee.

FRAGRANCE FREE

In order to accommodate clients and co-workers who are sensitive to chemicals in fragrances and perfumes, I ask that we maintain a fragrance-free office. Thank you for not using any of the following prior to our session: cologne, after shave, perfume, scented lotions, fragranced hair products, strongly scented laundry detergent or dryer sheets. Occasionally pure essential oils may be used therapeutically. If you have a favorite essential oil you wear, please discuss with your therapist.

RISKS TO COUNSELING

Counseling is not without risk. Some people experience an increase in feelings of stress, especially during the early stages of counseling. Exploring long-standing, deeply seated issues can sometimes initially seem to aggravate rather than help the issue. Some people find themselves feeling emotions and having insights that are new and uncomfortable, sometimes leading to feelings of discouragement and thoughts of quitting counseling. Some people are surprised by how others in their lives respond as counseling progresses. These dynamics are natural and to be expected. You may also experience other unique consequences of counseling. I encourage you to talk with me about them as and if they occur.

EMERGENCIES

If there is an emergency during our work together, or in the future after termination where I become concerned about your personal safety, the possibility of you injuring someone else, or about you receiving proper psychiatric care, I will do whatever I can, within the limits of the law, to prevent you from injuring yourself or others and to ensure that you receive the proper medical care. For this purpose I may also contact the person whose name you have provided on the biographical sheet.

YOUR RIGHTS AS A CLIENT

Your safety and comfort are my foremost concern. It is therefore important that boundaries are clear and honored in both bodywork and counseling. To these ends, and under the ethical code of professional relationship, any kind of sexual contact or activity between therapists and clients during the course of therapy is prohibited. The methods of touch in which I have been trained are done consciously, non-sexually, and always with your consent. However, if you ever feel uncomfortable in any way, it is important that you communicate that to me. You always have the right to stop or change any procedure at any time for any reason. You always have the right to know, beforehand, what methods will be employed. You always have the right to ask, at any time, any questions that arise for you.

CONSENT FOR THE USE OF TOUCH IN THERAPY

By signing below you are acknowledging that you understand the following: that your therapy operates in a body-mind model and that within that model a specific method of touch is available to you. You have received and read the statements that explain a holistic and body-oriented approach and which outline your rights as a client. You understand that touch, whenever used, is done consciously, non-sexually, and always with your consent. You further understand that you have the right at any time for whatever reason to modify or stop any methods of touch. You also understand that You may revoke, at any time, this agreement. Based on these understandings, you chose to incorporate the use of touch in our work together.
